On Saturday evening, July 9, 2022 Concern Foundation's 47th Annual Block Party will be BACK ON THE BLOCK at Paramount Studios Hollywood after two years of virtual events due to COVID-19 health and safety concerns. The anticipated sold-out event is expected to be attended by over 3,500 guests with a goal to exceed our previous record \$1.8 million dollars raised for cancer research.

This year Concern will be honoring entrepreneurs, philanthropists and community leaders **Janet Crown and Steve Robinson** with the first ever *Larry Powell Spirit of Concern Award* named after one of the founders of the organization. The backlot streets will be filled with plenty of musical and interactive entertainment on multiple stages featuring the Tom Nolan Band, D' City Sound & Events, and the Vibrato Grill Jazz stage. Throughout the venue guests will find photo studios, lounges, casino style gaming, and spa services provided by the Beauty Bus Foundation. One of the highlights of the evening will be the online silent and live auctions underwritten by ZACUTO GROUP that will feature items and packages including one-of-a-kind opportunities, concert and event tickets, restaurants, staycations, golf packages and so many other wonderful items donated by our friends throughout the community.

For the 16th year, Concern is honored to celebrate The Best of LA 2022® on Los Angeles magazine's street, which will feature lounges, photo booths, food stations, DJ dancing and much, much more. Once again, Los Angeles magazine will donate another \$25,000 to Concern to help further our mission.

Great food and beverages will be found up and down every street including notable mainstays of the Block Party, such as Vibrato Grill Jazz, Factor's Famous Deli, Bar Hayama & the California Sushi Academy, The Drago Group, Porta Via, Maria's Italian Kitchen, and Pink's Famous Hot Dogs just to name a few. CONCERN FUNDED RESEARCH IMPACT UPDATE

Selma Masri, PhD, assistant professor in the Department of Biological Chemistry at UCI School of Medicine

2018-2020 Conquer **Cancer Now Recipient**

New research by Selma Masri, PhD, assistant professor in the Department of Biological Chemistry at the University of California, Irvine School of Medicine reveals how the circadian regulation of glucose production in the liver is lost during lung cancer progression, and how the resulting increase in glucose production may fuel cancer cell growth. The circadian clock is our intrinsic biological pacemaker that maintains physiological homeostasis in all tissues of the body. Under conditions of stress, the biological clock is rewired as an adaptive mechanism to maintain synchrony and equilibrium throughout the body.

The new study titled, "Glucagon regulates the stability of REV-ERB α to modulate hepatic glucose production in a model of lung cancer-associated cachexia," illustrates how the circadian clock is regulated under conditions of stress such as lung cancer progression and cancer-associated tissue wasting disease called cachexia.

"Our research shows that a critical circadian protein, REV-ERBa, controls glucose production in the liver. During lung cancer progression and specifically under conditions of cachexia, this circadian regulation is lost, resulting in increased glucose production from the liver," said senior author Dr. Masri. "Based on our findings, we identified that lung tumors are able to provide instructive cues to the liver to increase glucose production, a major fuel source for cancer cells."

This research places the circadian clock as a central regulator of glucose production during lung cancer progression and provides important insight toward the development of novel therapeutics to target REV-ERBa to suppress cancer cell growth.

Rémi Buisson, PhD, assistant professor in the UCI School of Medicine Department of Biological Chemistry

2020-2022 Conquer **Cancer Now Recipient**

A new study led by Rémi Buisson, PhD, assistant professor in the University of California, Irvine School of Medicine Department of Biological Chemistry identifies two ways in which APOBEC3A— a vital enzyme responsible for genetic changes resulting in a variety of cancers while protecting our cells against viral infection—is controlled.

APOBEC3A is a vital part of the immune system that works to protect cells from viral infection by inducing mutations to block viruses from replicating. However, APOBEC3A also induces mutations by directly attacking cancer cell genomes, which results in increased levels of DNA mutations that lead to cancer progression, metastasis and drug resistance.

"In our previous studies, we demonstrated that APOBEC3A-induced DNA mutations are very frequent in cancer patients. In fact, we found they are present in up to 80 percent of certain cancer types such as lung, breast or bladder cancers," said Dr. Buisson.

This work illustrates how viral infection triggers a specific innate immune response to activate APOBEC3A expression in human cells and how it is an important step in the elimination of the virus. It also illustrates how different chemotherapeutic

drugs stimulate APOBEC3A, but through a completely different type of immune response, which cause mutations that further enhance cancer aggressivity.

"Together, our results reveal different ways for the cells to regulate APOBEC3A expression to address different types of stresses that the cell may encounter," said Buisson. "By understanding how cancer cells and viral infections regulate APOBEC3A expression, we are poised to take critical step forward toward the development of both new therapeutic strategies to fight cancer and new anti-viral therapies."

More work is needed to develop strategies to prevent mutations caused by APOBEC3A in the cancer genome that increase tumor heterogeneity, promoting disease progression and resistance to therapies. With regard to viral infections, the next step is to determine whether certain types of mutations previously detected in viruses such as SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) are the result of APOBEC3A activity and affect the replication of the virus in the cells.
